Reach Out for Help

"Action is the antidote to despair."

--Joan Baez

When someone you love dies, you must mourn if you are to renew your capacity for love. In other words, mourning brings healing. But healing also requires the support and understanding of those around you as you embrace the pain of your loss.

I've said that the wilderness of your grief is your wilderness and that it's up to you to find your way through it. That's true. But paradoxically, you also need companionship from time to time as you journey. You need people who will walk beside you and provide you with "divine momentum" -- affirmations that what you are doing is right and necessary for you and will lead to your eventual healing. You do not need people who walk in front of you and lead you down the path they think is right, nor do you need people who want to walk behind and not be present to your pain.

You've heard me urge you over and over again to seek out the support of the people in your life who are naturally good helpers. A few solid shoulders to cry on and a handful of pairs of listening ears can make all the difference in the world. For something so difficult, it's fundamentally simple, this journey to healing.

Sharing your pain with others won't make it disappear. But it will, over time, make it more bearable. Reaching out for help also connects you to other people and strengthens the bonds of love that make life seem worth living again.

Where to Turn for Help. "There is strength in numbers," one saying goes. Another echoes, "United we stand, divided we fall." If you are grieving, you may indeed find strength and a sense of stability if you draw on an entire support system for help. Friends and

family members can often form the core of your support system. Seek out people who encourage you to be yourself and who acknowledge your many thoughts and feelings about the death. What you need most now are caring, nonjudgmental listeners.

You may also find comfort in talking to a minister or other church leader. When someone loved dies, it is natural for you to feel ambivalent about your faith and question the very meaning of life. A clergy member who responds not with criticism but with empathy to all your feelings can be a valuable resource.

A professional counselor may also be a very helpful addition to your support system. In fact, a good counselor can be something friends and family can't: an objective listener. A counselor's office can be that safe

haven where you can "let go" of those feelings you're afraid to express elsewhere. What's more, a good counselor will then help you constructively channel those emotions.

For many grieving people, support groups are one of the best helping resources. In a group, you can connect with others who have experienced similar thoughts and feelings. You will be allowed and gently encouraged to talk about the person who died as much and as often as you like.

Remember, help comes in different forms for different people. The trick is to find the combination that works best for you and then make use of it.

The Rule of Thirds. In my own grief journey and in the lives of the mourners I have been privileged to counsel, I have discovered that, in general, you can take all the people in your life and divide them into thirds when it comes to grief support.

One third of the people in your life will turn out to be truly empathetic helpers. They will have a desire to understand you and your unique thoughts and feelings about the death.

They will demonstrate a willingness to be taught by you and a recognition that you, not them, are the expert of your experience. They will be willing to be involved in your pain and suffering without feeling the need to take it away from you. They will believe in your capacity to heal.

Another third of the people in your life will turn out to be neutral in their response to your grief. They will neither help nor hinder you in your journey.

The final third of people in your life will turn out to be harmful to you in your efforts to mourn and heal. While they are usually not setting out to intentionally harm you, they will judge you, they will try to take your grief away from you, and they will pull you off the path to healing.

Seek out your friends and family members who fall into the first group. They will be your confidants and momentum-givers on your journey. When you are actively mourning, try to avoid the last group, for they will trip you up and cause you to fall.

How Others Can Help You.

While there are a multitude of ways that people who care about you might reach out to help you, here are three important and fundamental helping goals. Effective helpers will help you:

- ♦ **Embrace Hope.** These are the people around you who help you sustain the presence of hope as you feel separated from those things that make your life worth living. They can be present to you in your loss, yet bring you a sense of trust in yourself that you can and will heal
- ♦ **Encounter the Presence of Your Loss.** These are the people who understand the need for you to revisit and recount the pain of your loss. They help you “tell your story” and provide a safe place for you to openly mourn. Essentially, they give you an invitation to take the grief that is inside you and share it outside yourself.

♦ **Have “Companions” in Your Journey.** These people serve as companions through whom your suffering can be affirmed. They are able to break through their separation from you and truly companion you where you are at this moment in time. They know that real compassion comes out of “walking with” you, not ahead of you or behind you. The word ‘grieve’ means to “bear a heavy burden.” Those who companion you in your grief realize that as they help bear your burden of sorrow, they give you hope that something good will be born of it.

Get Help Right Away When in Crisis. If your feelings of grief are so overwhelming that you’re afraid your life or the life of someone in your care is in danger, you are in crisis and should seek help immediately.

Signs of crisis include:

- Thinking about, planning or attempting suicide.
- Failing to care for yourself (eating, bathing, dressing)
- Abusing alcohol or drugs

If any of these warning signs apply to you, call one of the helping resources listed below without delay.

- 911
- Your local Crisis Hotline. Call Information or look them up in a phone directory.
- Your family physician
- Your local hospital
- Your community mental health center. (County government directories will usually have this information.)

Regardless of where you are on the path to healing, don’t be afraid to reach out for the help you need.

I cleaned the blinds and polished the silver -- just regular things, nothing special -- except I thought of you as I did them.

I told you about my Big Project and how far it seems to the end. I keep thinking of new ways to get it finished and that just makes the whole thing take longer, but of course you know that about me, don't you?

I watched you today. Did you see me, too? I watched a puppy scamper across the yard, tugging its young owner. I watched a brand-new driver trying to fit the car into

a parallel parking space and I laughed, remembering. Do you remember things?

I saw an old lady and an even older man holding hands as they crossed the street and the look they shared reminded me of us. That secret sharing of something just between them. I missed you today. Do you miss me?

I planned the menu for the family dinner today and I asked you what you wanted. Do you still like mashed potatoes and butter, green bean casserole and cranberry relish? I baked two pies and saved some dough for you so you could pat it out and fill it with strawberry jam and then bake it, making a little "patty pan pie" just for you. Do you still do that sometimes?

I counted the chairs and called a neighbor because I have to borrow two more. Or I guess two people could stand or maybe they won't

come. I washed three loads of laundry and ironed the tablecloth and put napkin rings out. I wished you were here

to help like you used to. You always put the napkin in the rings just so and made them look so special.

I wore your sweater today. I hope you don't mind. It turned cool and the breeze turned into a wind and I had to take the wind chime in. The last bits of summer are gone now, packed away until the next time around.

I found your blanket today, tucked way down in the cedar chest. I was looking for the afghan to put over the back of the rocking chair and there it was... waiting for me. So I hugged it and wrapped myself in it like you used to do. It was only for a moment, but I thought I heard you in the next room so I went to look. It was only the timer on the

dryer downstairs. But, for a moment, I thought it was you.

I saw you today... in a hundred places - in the house, the yard, across the street, waiting in line at the bank and walking just ahead of me at the grocery store. Why didn't you turn around? Didn't you know I was there?

I sang to you today. I'm still not very good but the choir master say I am "enthusiastic." Maybe it will be my ticket of admission; enthusiasm should be worth something, somewhere.

I dreamed of you today and for just a little while, we were one again. Hand in hand, arm in arm, head to head, heart to heart, lives wrapped around and through each other, like two peas in a pod, two puppies in a basket, two people in love. I haven't stopped loving you... have you stopped loving me? I hope not.

I'll be okay. I am okay. It's just that sometimes, I want you here, right here with me, not just in my thoughts, my dreams, my prayers, my me. I want you here...

And then, you are. I only have to touch my heart to feel yours beating. I only have to whisper your name to hear mine spoken. I only have to count my blessings, count the moments we had, to know I am rich beyond any man's measure. We were and still are, and that's all I need. It wasn't enough and it will never be enough, but it was something, and for that I am forever thankful... today, tomorrow and always.

Even if we are just working around it until we figure it out -- Christmas is still here. We can sit down, be surrounded and comforted by the beautiful, ancient, solid promise of Christmas.
